

News From HRSA

Two HRSA-Funded Studies are Seeking Feedback on Key Issues in Home Visiting

Helping Home Visiting Learn from COVID-19: The Assessing and Describing Practice
Transitions Among Evidence-Based Home Visiting Programs in Response to the COVID-19

Public Health Emergency study is learning from programs that successfully adapted to the pandemic. They want to know more about three practices, 1) promoting children's engagement and participation in virtual home visits; 2) using informal contacts to promote caregivers' engagement and satisfaction; and 3) coaching to promote positive caregiver-child interactions in home visiting.

Improving Home Visiting Quality: The Home Visiting Assessment of Implementation Quality study is looking at what makes home visiting programs effective. They're focusing on two areas including <u>exploring family voice</u> and <u>leadership and better addressing disparities through home visiting</u>.

BMC Public Health is calling for submissions of rigorous research that can inform interventions and policy for their collection on Maternal and child access to health and healthcare. The goal of the collection is to highlight the barriers to access to healthcare for women and children, especially among underserved populations. Deadline is April 18, 2024.

Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health's 2024 Diversity Summer Internship Program (DSIP)

- Meetings and other networking opportunities


