Support Research on Home Visiting Implementation Quality

MIECHV-funded programs are invited to help HRSA and researchers from **Child Trends** understand what makes home visiting programs most effective by participating in the Home Visiting Assessments of Implementation Quality (HV-AIM) project! The project consists of three studies to explore how family voice and leadership, addressing race equity and disparities, and supervision contribute to overall quality for home visiting programs, each with separate opportunities for participation.

Data collection for the family voice and leadership study will begin on August 26th. Federal project officers will share more information and a link to complete a survey about family voice and leadership opportunities in home visiting programs with MIECHV awardees and Tribal MIECHV grant recipients. Data collection for the study addressing race equity will begin in mid-September, and data collection for the study addressing supervision will begin in early November.
