## **HARC Members: Home Visiting Programs**

There are 385 home visiting staff (program managers/directors, supervisors, home visitors, data managers and others) enrolled in the HARC PBRN as of October 2024. These staff represent 363 distinct home visiting programs. Below is a summary of the characteristics of those home visiting programs as reported by their staff.
