## **Recent Work by HARC PBRN Members!**

### Effects of Nurse-Home Visiting on Intimate Partner Violence and Maternal Income, Mental Health and Self-efficacy by 24 Months Postpartum: A Randomised Controlled Trial

This month, HARC PBRN member, Nicole Catherine, and colleagues published their **study** evaluating the impact of Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) on maternal outcomes (e.g., intimate partner violence (IPV), income, mental health and self-efficacy) in British Columbia, Canada. Findings revealed that NFP lead to favorable benefits for maternal-reported IPV, income, mental health and self-efficacy when the children were two years of age. The authors will continue to follow these children to assess further emerging benefits.


