

# Criminal Legal System Experiences Among Families Receiving Home Visiting Services: A Scoping Review of the Literature

This month, several members of HARC's Justice System Involved Families special interest group co-authored a **scoping review** of the literature to better understand criminal legal system (CLS) experiences among families participating in early childhood home visiting services. Findings showed the need for more information about CLS experiences of families participating in home visiting programs.



## Developmental Monitoring and Promotion in Home Visiting: A Qualitative Study of Parents and Providers

This month, HARC member David Bard and colleagues published results from their qualitative <u>study</u> exploring how home visiting programs monitor and promote child development. The team used

**HARC's Precision Paradigm** to inform the interview guides and to interpret the results.

Findings from this study revealed that while home visiting programs are prioritizing developmental monitoring and promotion, barriers exist that negatively impact provider and parent efforts to support positive child development.

# Home-Delivered Pediatric Weight Management for Low-Income Families: A Randomized Controlled Trial

This month, HARC member Bradley Appelhans and colleagues published results from their **study** of a home visiting pediatric obesity intervention. While there were no significant differences in overall 12-month weight loss outcomes between the home-delivered and clinic-delivered interventions, session attendance and total contact time predicted larger decreases in zBMI, and both were greater in the home-delivered intervention.


